# **COVID-19 Immunizations and Boosters**

Labrador-Grenfell Health is advising the public that we are increasing efforts to provide COVID-19 immunizations and boosters to eligible individuals across the region.

#### Individuals who are:

- Individuals 5 years of age and older are encouraged to get vaccinated with a primary series (two doses) of an mRNA vaccine at least eight weeks apart.
- moderately to severely immunocompromised are encouraged to get vaccinated with a primary series (three doses) of an mRNA vaccine at least eight weeks apart.
- Individuals 18 years of age and older are recommended to receive a booster dose of an mRNA vaccine at least 22 weeks (154 days) after their second dose.
- Individuals 17 years of age and younger are not recommended to receive a booster dose at this time.

We encourage the public to check the schedule regularly as clinic availability is updated frequently. At this time, walk-ins are not being accepted.
